<b>(cop)</b>	copular (verb) used for grammatical purposes	<b>idiom</b>	idiomatic or figurative expression

<b>ad</b>	modifier of noun or verb (adjective or adverb or mixture)	<b>np</b>	Proper Noun (such as a name)

<b>an / vn</b>	active noun/verbal noun	<b>part</b>	particle, short word used for emphasis or for grammatical purposes
